If they live in Bladen, Brunswick, Columbus, New Hanover, Onslow, or Pender county they may qualify for the Healthy Opportunities Program. This is a free program using their Medicaid health plan.

To qualify for Healthy Opportunities Pilot services, Medicaid Managed Care enrollees in Standard Plans must live in a Pilot Region and have qualifying physical/behavioral health criteria and at least one social risk factor:

At least one Physical/Behavioral Health Criteria (varies by population):

- Adults (e.g., having two or more qualifying chronic conditions such as cardiovascular or pulmonary disease/heart or lung issues, chronic mental illness, substance use disorder, or repeated incidents of emergency department use or hospital admissions)
- Pregnant Women (e.g., history of poor birth outcomes such as low birth weight)
- Children, ages 0-3 (e.g., neonatal intensive care unit graduate)
- Children, ages 0-21 (e.g., experiencing three or more categories of adverse childhood experiences)

AND

At least one Social Risk Factor:

- Homeless and/or housing insecure
- Food insecure
- Transportation insecure
- Experiencing toxic stress, in need of parenting support
